VSPM Academy of Higher Education, Nagpur has made this objective its mission. Its focus has been extremely clear. It has emphasized on education, social upliftment and the removal of social evils.

The results of the last three decades of efforts has been the setting-up of 55 quality education institutions right from the pre primary schools to medical college, setting up of social institutions for the backward and women and innumerable programmers for removal of social evils.

VSPM Academy of Higher Education has a clear vision and is committed to its mission.

The Trust - A Historical Perspective

Founded by Dr. Bhausaheb Bhoge, a dedicated social worker, in the year 1971 with a mission the VSPM Academy of Higher Education, Nagpur (Formerly - Vidya Shikshan Prasarak Mandal) is a registered trust under the Indian Societies Registration Act 1860 and also under Bombay Public Trust Act 1950. Late Padmashree Kamlatai Hospet, a lady social worker, was its first president. Since 1981 Shree Ranjeet Deshmukh is the president of the trust.

The institution with philosophy of recognizing education has one of the pious obligations. It aims to promote unity and brotherhood, setting-up of institutions, imparting education in various faculties, opening higher education centres, child education, professional training, centres of excellence, promotion of cooperative movement in various industrial and non industrial programmes with particular emphasis on child, women, family welfare, adult education, fight against social - cultural evils and create awareness towards progress amongst people who are rural base and who are the last link of the nation. This includes programmes for people who are below poverty line.

THE TRUST - TODAY

VSPM AHE is managed by prominent citizens known for their commitment to the cause of less privileged and representing various facets of social life, led by visionary Mr. Ranjeet Deshmukh who looked in his fledgling form and made it the unparalleled powerhouse of education and social work. It boasts of a 55 institutions including primary schools, middle college, training college for teachers, a management institute, a nursing college, a dental college, hostels for backward students and even a large multispecialty hospital. Over 1,00,000 students have benefited from the various institutions of the trust and more than 15,000 students are enrolled in these institutions in an academic year.

VSPM's COP

VSPM's College of Physiotherapy has continued evolving from a small clinical setup, at LMH (Buldi) in the year 1990, to a present well equipped institution.

VSPM's College of physiotherapy was started in the year 1999 with the support and encouragement of Hon'ble Chairman Shri. Ranjeet Deshmukh and founder Shri. Bhausaheb Bhoge. Dr Mangala Deshpande, Director and Dr.Maneesha Deshpande were the founder staff members. The college got undergraduate approval in August 1999 with 33 students and had 100% result in 1st year BPTh.

VSPM's College of Physiotherapy has attained a prestigious status due to the personal interest and strenuous efforts taken by the committed team of office bearers.

Presently the college has an intake of 50 undergraduate as well as 21 post graduate students per year, 16 MUHS approved teaching staff and well-equipped Kinesiotherapy, Electrotherapy, Musculoskeletal, Neurosciences, Cardio-Respiratory and Community based rehabilitation Labs.

VSPM's College of Physiotherapy is the only Physiotherapy College in Vidarbha region running the PhD course.

The college also bears Special Investigation Apparatus like Gait and Motion analysis lab, EMG-NCV studies, Power lab for exercise testing and VO2 analysis, Pulmonary function testing, Exercise testing for Cardio-Respiratory endurance, Advanced Combination electrotherapy modalities and Laser therapy.

The institute serves to provide specialized clinical facilities like wound healing, pain management, obesity management, physiotherapy management in traumatic and non-traumatic musculoskeletal conditions, adult and paediatric conditions, women's health, geriatrics and community based rehabilitation.

The institute also runs peripheral outreach centres at Jaitala and Katol, Nagpur, and in-house physiotherapy services at Geriatrics rehabilitation at Panchwati and Matoshree (adasa) and Rehabilitation for specially able children at Government centres (DDRC). The institute also has MOUs with various industrial sectors and companies for industrial rehab.

The College was one among the first institutions to undergo for Impact Assessment from MUHS, Nashik on 11/04/2018. The college scored 557.44 out of 600 in part A and in part B 634 out of 1000 and earned GRADE "A".

The college has a future plan of starting specialty practices like Parkinson's club, Stroke club, Sports rehabilitation, Cerebral palsy club.

VSPM's College of Physiotherapy also started "Recruitment Drive" Program since the last year, where the passed out students have got placements at various places.

VSPM's COP believes in clinical and academic excellence as well as personal mentoring of students to prepare them to achieve great height in becoming skillful clinicians and ideal professionals in future to serve humanity.
